## Durham Public Works Department Head Report 4-27-21

- I am working on the contract document for the three-year paving plan. I have received the final docs (book) and have had Rob review it. The book is too large of a file to email. The last time we signed a maintenance paving contract in 2018 I just brought the book to the meeting and passed it around. I scheduled a meeting with Crooker and the engineer at Crooker's office on May 4<sup>th</sup> to sign the documents for the three -year contract. I am looking for authorization to sign the docs on that date.
- The Army Corp Of Engineer permits have been submitted for the stream crossing grants. The ACOE
  has requested additional information that the engineer is putting together. Engineer is requesting
  permission from MDEP to allow us to bid while ACOE permit is pending.
- I have been working on the Vehicle Weight Restriction Ordinance. After reviewing it with Pete Coughlan of the MDOT Maine Local Roads division we determined that the ordinance had some significant flaws. It appears that the ordinance was started using the MMA Model and that there were some improper references made to MDOT as well as a few outdated references. Pete and I have been working on an updated ordinance to differentiate between year- round and seasonal postings and cleaning up the references. Pete also changed the definition of Frozen Road to match the 2019 updated MDOT definition of "solidly frozen". I had hoped to have this ironed out a bit better before the meeting so I am continuing with it today and will send out something by the end of today.
  - I was informed today by the MDOT that the Meadow Road & Rt 125 intersection project has been delayed due to CMP transferring the lines. They believe that the start date will now be sometime between the May 10<sup>th</sup> and the 17<sup>th</sup>.

- Public Works crews have been hard at work with Spring clean-up of all Town properties. We have also finished ditching on Mill Pond Road as the road became very soft. WE have started work on the gravel roads repairing winter damage and pot holes. We have also been working on cleanup of trees and branches in the ditch-lines as a result of storm damage over the winter.
- Public Works has gone back to their summer hours of four ten- hour days Mon-Thurs
