Durham Public Works Department Head Report 5-11-21

- I forwarded the bid tab from the contract documents to the Board after the last meeting. I rescheduled the signing to May 18th. I am looking for authorization to sign the docs on that date.
- The Army Corp Of Engineer permits have been submitted for the stream crossing grants. The ACOE
 has requested additional information that the engineer is putting together. Engineer is requesting
 permission from MDEP to allow us to bid while ACOE permit is pending. Hope to have an update
 before the meeting.
- I sent the proposed Weight Restriction Ordinance to the Board just prior to the last Board meeting. Hopefully everyone has had a chance to review it and have a discussion at the meeting. Pete Coughlan of the MDOT Maine Local Roads division and I determined that the ordinance had some significant flaws. It appears that the ordinance was started using the MMA Model and that there were some improper references made to MDOT as well as a few outdated references. Pete and I have modified the ordinance to differentiate between year- round and seasonal postings and cleaned up the references. Pete also changed the definition of Frozen Road to match the 2019 updated MDOT definition of "solidly frozen".
- I have been in discussions with the MDOT regarding the Meadow Road & Rt 125 intersection. Back when they decided to do the rebuild by joining our contract with crooker, we had agreed at a transition point to merge the two projects. Since they backed out of that agreement, they had moved the transition point back toward Roue 125 which would leave a 125 ft section of Meadow Rd with just an overlay of pavement that we put on as a band aid to carry us over to the intersection rebuild. After several discussions, MDOT has agreed box-cut to our rebuild point and rebuild to that point. They are still waiting for Comcast to remove the old poles before they can start construction. They will give me an update later this week.
- Public Works crew has been working on gravel roads, adding gravel, repairing pot holes, and shaping them up.
