

## ADDENDUM A

### DURHAM WASTE REDUCTION & RECYCLING RULES FOR CURBSIDE COLLECTION

WHERE – at curbside, on the right hand side of the road as the hauler drives along.

WHEN – trash should be put out by 7:00 AM on the day that it is to be picked up.

WHAT CAN BE PLACED CURBSIDE – regular household waste, which must be placed in waterproof and tagged containers. Household recyclables including corrugated cardboard, brown paper bags, newspapers, magazines, phone books, clear glass, aluminum cans, steel/tin type cans, mixed paper, paperboard, and #2 plastics, placed in recycling containers, cardboard or plastic boxes.

TAGS – each bag or trash can containing regular household waste must be tagged. If no tag is attached the bag will not be picked up. Tags must not be taped to bags or cans. Recyclables do not require tags.

HOW MUCH – maximum weight is 25 pounds per bag or can. Maximum size of cans is 32 gallons. If a bag or can exceeds the weight limit or can exceeds the size limit it will not be picked up. There is no limit on the number of tagged bags put out by a household. The reasonable person standard will be used with regard to household recycling.

TAGS – each household is entitled to 26 free tags as of April 1 of each year. New property owners are entitled to a pro-rated amount of tags, 1 for every two weeks remaining until the next April 1. Tags for rental units are limited to 26 regardless of tenant changes. Additional tags can be purchased for \$3.00 each.

#### PROHIBITED ITEM AT CURBSIDE

Large metal objects or appliances.

Compostable materials – leaves, trees, mulch, pumpkins, pet litter.

Animal body parts.

Furniture.

Small appliances.

Large plastic items.

Construction debris.

Tires.

Batteries.
